
Examining income risk factors for people with disabilities

2013 Second Quarter Report July 2013



The quarterly unemployment rate for people with disabilities continues to be significantly higher than for those with no disabilities.

Quarterly unemployment rates




The second-quarter unemployment rate for people with disabilities rose more than one-half of a percentage point compared to first quarter 2013, while the rate for those with no disabilities declined to its lowest quarterly rate since Allsup began issuing the Income at Risk report in 2009. For second quarter 2013, people with disabilities experienced an unemployment rate nearly 90 higher than people with no disabilities.

The monthly unemployment rate for people with disabilities began a steady climb in the second quarter of 2013.

18-month unemployment rates




The unemployment rate for people with disabilities climbed to a 15-month high in June 2013 with 14.2 percent and continues to fluctuate more widely than the rate for those with no disabilities.

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) applications continued to stabilize in the second quarter.

SSDI applications



The number of people applying for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits increased by about 1.6 percent from the first quarter to the second quarter of 2013. However, for the first six months of 2013, SSDI applications declined by nearly 6 percent compared with the first six months of 2012.
