
# Examining income risk factors for people with disabilities

2010 First Quarter Review April 2010



The unemployment rate for people with disabilities continues to be significantly higher than for those with no disabilities.

#### **Quarterly unemployment rates**




The first quarter 2010 average unemployment rate for people with disabilities remained above the rate for the same period last year. For the first quarter 2010, people with disabilities experienced an average unemployment rate nearly 40 percent higher than people with no disabilities.

The unemployment rate for people with disabilities and those with no disabilities remain high.

#### 15-month unemployment rates




After widening significantly in January 2010, the gap in unemployment rates between people with and without disabilities narrowed during the last two months of the first quarter. Unemployment rates for both groups ended the first quarter higher than a year ago. People with disabilities consistently have higher rates of unemployment than those without disabilities.
